Vinland Street asphalt paving project completed summer of 2021

In the spring of 2020, the Town of Oshkosh was a recipient of the State of Wisconsin Multimodal Local Supplement (MLS) grant award program to repair one and a half miles of Vinland Street. Ninety percent of the approximate half-million dollar project was funded by the State.

The project stalled when Wisconsin Public Service and communication companies decided to upgrade services in the road right-of-way postponing the project construction to 2021.

Once the construction began in 2021, Martenson & Eisle and Northeast Asphalt did a super job in assuring minimal interruptions and a great finished product.

NEVER PUT MEDICAL SHARPS IN YOUR TRASH OR RECYCLING CART!

Guidelines for Sharps Users:

- Place used or discarded sharps in an acceptable sharps container.
- Take used sharps to a designated collection facility for proper disposal
- **DO NOT** place used sharps in coffee cans, plastic milk jugs, plastic bags, aluminum cans or soda bottles. These containers mistakenly end up in recycling collection trucks and burst open.

Wood Chipper Operations Saturdays Only

Town residents may bring branches to the town hall on Saturdays only between the times **9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.** from April through October.

Branches must be 3" in diameter or less. There is a sign at the town hall on the outbuilding instructing where to leave the branches.

Town residents are welcome to take the wood chips during the same time mentioned above on Saturdays.

It is **NOT** a dumping site for grass clippings or any other products or items. Only minimum sized branches are allowed.

Violators will be cited.

What is Stormwater?

Stormwater is water from rain or melting snow that does not soak into the ground. It flows from rooftops, over paved areas, bare soil, and sloped lawns. As it flows, stormwater runoff collects and transports animal waste, litter, salt, pesticides, fertilizers, oil & grease, and other potential pollutants.

The Town of Oshkosh maintains an EPA mandated—DNR approved Stormwater Discharge Permit. Gray water from sump pits are considered illegal illicit discharges.

What can be done to prevent storm water pollution?

- Don't dump waste into the road right-of-way ditches.
- Reroute illicit discharges into sanitary sewers.
- Don't fill or block road right-of-way ditches.
- Dispose of waste properly in trash cans or dumpsters.
- Maintain vehicles and other equipment in order to prevent fluid leaks. Recycle unused hazardous oils or liquids.
- Use lawn or garden chemicals sparingly. Choose organic alternatives when possible and check the weather forecast to avoid applying them before a storm.
- Consider minimizing impervious surfaces around your home. Use bricks, gravel, cobbles, natural stone, or permeable pavers instead of asphalt or concrete when possible.
- Composting yard waste/grass clippings is recommended.
- Create a rain garden with native plants, low maintenance plants and grasses. They often have longer root systems, which reduce the amount of chemicals and water needed.
- Learn about organic gardening, instead of resorting to pesticides and chemical fertilizers.
- Volunteer to pick up trash along a road way.

While Plummer Cemetery has been transitioning along with the rest of society: the basic premise remains the same, “to maintain the beauty of the property in order that visitors may receive a feeling of peacefulness and natural dignity that a cemetery would suggest.” In essence, a cemetery is a time portal connecting the past to the future through the present. Plummer Cemetery is no exception, serving the past, present and future residents of the Town of Oshkosh and surrounding communities.

FUTURE provided by Tom Gabert

Plummer Cemetery is in the process of future expansion in the 1999 Stearns/Leach area which may include cremation only burial, scatter area as allowed by statute and/or columbarium (mini mausoleum for cremation urns). There will also be a prairie grass area (minimum maintenance required).

ROBERT PHILLIP PLUMMER, 86, passed away March 5, 2022 after an incredibly full “well-lived” life.

Bob lived in the town of Oshkosh for over 50 years. He was the developer of Harbor Valley (Primrose Ln, etc). He was the great grandson of Mark Plummer who donated land to town for the cemetery. They are all buried in Plummer Cemetery.
