
## Message from the Chief

## 2022 Accomplishments

- ISO rating lowered from 6 to 5.
- 14 members completed Fire Officer 1 course through NWTC.
- 3 members completed state certified Driver Operator/Engine course.
- Recruited 3 new members, all who had Firefighter 1 State Certification.
- Awarded WPS rewarding responders grant for new Flir K2 thermal imaging camera for \$2000.00.
- Awarded Wi DNR FFP grant for forestry hose/nozzles, back pack pumps, class A foam, and 10 pairs of firefighting boots.
- New battery operated positive pressure fan, portable firefighting ground monitor,
   Milwaukee power tools, and battery operated roof ventilation saw was purchased with donation/fundraising money to a total of \$8799.50. No taxpayers money was utilized for the purchase of this equipment.
- Members trained for a total of 972 hours throughout the year.
- Donation received from Kyle Weber (Managing Partner) Modern Woodmen of America for \$5000.00.



- A committee was formed to design and spec a new fire engine to replace our 27
  year old engine. The current engine is at the end of its service life and required increased maintenance/part failures.
