



2023 Accomplishments

- 3 members completed Fire Fighter 2 course through FVTC
- 3 members completed state certified Driver Operator/Engine course
- One Officer attended 47 hours of training in Milwaukee and is now Certified through the International Association of Arson Investigators as a Fire Investigation Technician
- 2 members completed 3 day ICS-300 certification
- Recruited 3 new members
- Fire department members trained for 693 hours in 2023
- Awarded donation from Paul Davis Restoration for \$250
- Awarded donation from Oshkosh Area Women's Association for \$1500.00
- Received donation from Country Financial for \$1500.00
- Donation received from Kyle Weber (Managing Partner) Modern Woodmen of America for \$1000.00
- New RAM XD Portable Firefighting Monitor, UTV Wildland Skid Pump, Rescue 42
 Struts, Milwaukee Portable Light and Drill/Driver Kit, Pi-Lit Emergency Roadway
 Flares, and multiple pails of Class A PFAS free Firefighting Foam were purchased with donation/fundraising money to a total of \$16,877.94. No taxpayer money was utilized for the purchase of this equipment.

Apparatus Updates

2023 was a very exciting year for the fire department. In joint project between the first responders and the fire department, two new apparatus were purchased using a combination of grants from the State of Wisconsin, as well as a donation from the Carol Waters Estate. A 2023 Chevrolet Silverado, now called Utility 25, and a 2023 Can-Am Defender, now called UTV 25 joined our fleet. These two apparatus are vehicles we have never had at our disposal before. Utility 25 will serve as a towing platform for the UTV, as well as an EMS response vehicle for fires and car accidents and a general utility vehicle for the fire department. UTV 25 will serve as a brush fire unit during the warm weather months, with a firefighting skid on the back and in the cold months, as an EMS off road vehicle, with a dedicated EMS skid. At all times both skids carry a stokes basket and can move patients from difficult to reach places like the Wiouwash Trail or farm fields.
